SAT TEST registration required

The SAT test will be administered October 16 (during the school day). Due to our limited number of tests, seniors who are applying to colleges that require the SAT or who are National Merit Scholarship finalists will receive priority placement. Other registrants will be placed on a waiting list.

Students must register at the College Placement Office by September 19. The test fee is \$50 and must be paid by check only (payable to Mater Dei).

PSAT TEST registration required

All juniors and high achieving sophomores are encouraged to register for the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) test, which will be administered October 16 (during the school day). The PSAT assesses critical thinking, math, and writing skills, and prepares students for the SAT college entrance exam. In addition, students who earn high scores on both the PSAT and the SAT are then eligible for the prestigious National Merit Scholarship Program.

Students must register at the College Placement Office. The test fee is \$18 and must be paid by check only (payable to Mater Dei). Early registration is recommended, as we possess a limited number of tests.

MATER DEI COLLEGE NIGHT

Mater Dei families are invited to our annual College Night Wednesday, October 9, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. In addition to gaining information from a variety of institutions, families may attend a financial aid presentation at 6:30 p.m. or 7:15 p.m. in the Lampe Commons.

COLLEGE PLACEMENT OFFICE ON PLUSPORTALS

Mrs. Goetz is pleased to announce that all parents are enrolled in the College Placement group on PlusPortals. (To access the group, on the homepage, above the main menu, select "Groups.")

This group includes information related to college fairs, college visits to Mater Dei, ACT test prep and test dates, and scholarship opportunities; as well as websites related to the college placement process, including preparing for the ACT and SAT, searching for colleges, applying to colleges, applying for financial aid, and NCAA eligibility.

KEY STEPS FOR APPLYING TO COLLEGES

Application Deadlines Students must carefully review application deadlines, as meeting application deadlines may be a requirement for merit scholarships.

Transcripts Students must order transcripts through Parchment Exchange. Mrs. Goetz will then review the order with the student prior to processing the order.

The Common Application Mrs. Goetz will electronically submit transcripts and the "Counselor's Report." Students must verify that the colleges to which they applied successfully accessed their completed application and supporting materials.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) The new FAFSA will be available October 1. To begin your application, visit www.fafsa.ed.gov.

NCAA ATHLETICS ELIGIBILITY

Sophomores, juniors and seniors who are considering playing athletics at an NCAA Division I or Division II college or university should register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. The NCAA Eligibility Center website is www.eligibilitycenter.org

NOTES

In order for Mater Dei to receive ACT scores, the registration must include our CEEB code (where a student attends school): 140-395.

Test accommodations must be requested at the time of registration. International and ELL students are eligible for extended time.

COLLEGE VISITATIONS

Recognizing the importance of college visits for our seniors, we have established the following college visitation policy:

Seniors are provided two school days between August 17 and April 30 for visits.

Seniors must request permission for a visit from the College Placement Office one week in advance. A note with a parent signature must be presented at the time of the request.

Seniors must obtain the signature of a college official on the visitation form provided by the College Placement Office. This form must be presented to the main office when students return to school.
