FREE ACT ACADEMY ONLINE Students are encouraged to visit the ACT Academy website to register for free personalized ACT practice (academy.act.org). Free video instruction is also available.

NEED MONEY FOR COLLEGE? FILE THE FAFSA NOW

Parents may file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at this time at www.studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa. For assistance, contact Mrs. Goetz.

NOTE: Parents will utilize the 2020 income tax information that is on file with the IRS. The IRS Data Retrieval Tool simplifies this process.

NOTE: Parents must create an FSA ID for both the student and one parent prior to beginning the process ("Apply for Aid" menu, "Filling Out the FAFSA Form" sub-menu, "Creating an FSA ID" page). The information must match the information on each person's social security card.

NOTE: Remember to submit the FAFSA to all colleges to which your student plans to apply.

COLLEGE PLACEMENT OFFICE ON PLUSPORTALS

Mrs. Goetz is pleased to announce that all parents are enrolled in the College Placement group on PlusPortals. (To access the group, on the homepage, above the main menu, select "Groups.")

This group includes information related to college fairs, college visits to Mater Dei, ACT test prep and test dates, and scholarship opportunities; as well as websites related to the college placement process, including preparing for the ACT and SAT, searching for colleges, applying to colleges, applying for financial aid, and NCAA eligibility.

ELIGIBILITY FOR NCAA ATHLETICS Sophomores, juniors, and

seniors who are considering playing athletics at an NCAA Division I or Division II college or university should register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at www.eligibilitycenter.org.

NOTES

In order for Mater Dei to receive ACT scores, the registration must include our CEEB code (where a student attends school): 140-395.

Test accommodations must be requested at the time of registration. International and ELL students are eligible for extended time.

To avoid extra fees in the future, at the time of registration, students should list potential college choices to which they would like their ACT scores to be sent.

ACT TEST ANSWERS

Students who complete the ACT test at a national test center on a national test date in December, April, or June may order the ACT Test Information Release (TIR) for \$30 per test date.

The TIR may be ordered at the time of registration or during the six-month period after the student's test date.

The TIR provides a digital copy of the test questions, a student's answers, and the answer key. For the writing test, a student will receive a copy of the writing prompt, the scoring rubric, and the scores assigned to the student's essay.

CLASS OF 2021 ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

ACT PERFORMANCE

<u>Illinois State Scholars</u> The average of the ACT composite scores for the fourteen Illinois State Scholars is 28.4.

<u>Valedictorians</u> The average of the ACT composite scores for the nine valedictorians is 27.

ACT Composite Scores of 31 or Higher The top 10% (7) ACT composite scores are all 31 or higher and have an average of 32.3.

<u>ACT Composite Scores of 27 or Higher</u> The top 15% (12) ACT composite scores are all 27 or higher and have an average of 30.3.

<u>ACT Composite Scores of 25 or Higher</u> The top 20% (16) ACT composite scores are all 25 or higher and have an average of 28.9.

ACT Composite Scores of 23 or Higher The top 41% (33) ACT composite scores are all 23 or higher and have an average of 26.1.

We are pleased to share ACT composite score statistics, as well as additional academic accomplishments for our Class of 2021.

ADDITIONAL ACADEMIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

<u>Scholars</u> The Class of 2021 included fourteen Illinois State Scholars, which is 15% of the eligible members of the class. (The state average is 10% of a class.)

<u>Scholarships</u> Sixty-three percent of the members of the Class of 2021 received scholarship offers, which totaled over \$8 million.

<u>College Credit Hours</u> During their four years at Mater Dei, the members of the Class of 2021 earned a total of 1,510 hours of college credit though enrollment in our dual credit courses, which is an average of 15 credit hours per student. These total hours equate to a total savings of at least \$670,000 (based on an average of \$445 per credit hour).

National Honor Society (NHS) Fifty percent of the Class of 2021 were members of NHS, having earned a GPA of 3.6 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

IT'S TIME TO PREPARE FOR COLDER WEATHER



To assist you in ensuring that your child adheres to the dress code, we are providing a detailed explanation of "winter" clothing. Please know that your assistance is appreciated!

<u>SWEATSHIRTS</u>: Sweatshirts <u>with a Mater Dei logo</u>, as well as sweatshirts purchased at an IHSA or ICCA event, may be worn over another shirt. Hoods must remain down during the school day.

<u>SWEATERS</u>: Sweaters that are solid black, solid navy, or solid white, may be worn over a dress code shirt.

note: The term "sweater" includes the traditional meaning of "sweater" <u>and</u> a fleece pull-over with a zipper at the neck (<u>not a "full" zipper</u> down the entire front, which is defined as a jacket). Thus, a jacket does <u>not</u> meet the definition of a sweater, even if it is solid black, solid navy, or solid white. Additionally, the term "solid" is defined as <u>not</u> having a logo, with the exception of a Mater Dei logo, which is an acceptable option.

JACKETS AND COATS: Jackets and coats <u>with a Mater Dei logo</u> may be worn during the school day.

Finally, to answer the most common question regarding jackets, coats, and solid color sweatshirts — without a Mater Dei logo it is <u>not</u> acceptable, but with a Mater Dei logo it is acceptable.

CALENDAR DRIVE INCENTIVES

1) A student who meets his/her quota of eight (8) or more calendar sales will receive a day off school April 22, 2022.

2) After a student sells eight (8) calendars (\$200), he/she may wear jeans or sweatpants and a Mater Dei spirit shirt or sweatshirt on all Fridays during the Calendar Drive (through and including January 28, 2022).

3) <u>Each</u> homeroom that meets its quota will receive a snack. When <u>all</u>
students in a homeroom meet their quota, they will receive a free beverage
coupon.

4) When a student sells ten (10) or more calendars, he/she will earn special dress days <u>and</u> receive prize money as follows: \$5 for the first ten (10) calendars sold and \$10 for <u>each additional five (5)</u> calendars sold.

5) When a student is the seller of a daily calendar drawing winner, he/she will receive a "front of the lunch line" pass.

6) For the freshman, sophomore, and junior classes, the top salesperson in <u>each</u> class will receive a \$500 tuition credit, and the second place salesperson in <u>each</u> class will receive a \$200 tuition credit. (Credit surpassing a tuition balance will be applied to next year's tuition.)

7) For the senior class, the top salesperson will receive a \$500 tuition
credit, the second place salesperson will receive a \$250 tuition credit, and
the third place salesperson will receive a \$150 tuition credit. (Credit
surpassing a tuition balance will be awarded in cash.)

8) The last day to earn prizes is January 31, 2022. Prize money will be available February 3, 2022, through February 26, 2022.
