Scholarships and Memorial Grants

Scholarships are based on a variety of qualifications – academic, leadership, financial need, and/or parish, school, or community affiliation.

Memorial grants are based on financial need.

KNIGHTS LEARN

EXTENSIVE CURRICULUM Our extensive, multi-level curriculum provides all students, including those needing academic accommodations, with the opportunity both to challenge themselves and to achieve success.

The curriculum includes multiple courses in agricultural science, art, business education, computer science, and industrial education; as well as a CNA (Certified Nurse Assistant) program, a culinary arts course, and a sewing course.

CLASS SIZE With an average class size of 18, students receive individual instruction, guidance, and assistance from knowledgeable and dedicated faculty.

PREPARATION FOR COLLEGE Our Director of College Placement provides information and workshops related to the college placement process, including preparing for the ACT and SAT, searching for and applying to colleges, applying for scholarships and financial aid, and NCAA eligibility. In addition, we host a College Fair and offer an ACT prep course taught by our faculty members.

COLLEGE CREDIT HOURS For no additional fee, our dual credit courses are offered at Mater Dei in conjunction with Kaskaskia College.* These courses provide numerous advantages following graduation: valuable credit for college-level coursework, financial savings, and the ability to earn additional minors or majors or to graduate early. * *Residential Electricity is offered off-campus for an additional fee.*

During the 2021-2022 school year, our students earned nearly 1,600 hours of college credit.

NATIONAL RURAL & SMALL TOWN RECOGNITION

Six students earned recognition from College Board after scoring in the top 10% (by state) on the fall 2021 PSAT test and possessing a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

CLASS OF 2022 ACT SCORES AND ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

ACT Composite Scores of 30 or Higher

The top 15% of scores (11) are all 30 or higher and have an average of 31.2.

ACT Composite Scores of 28 or Higher

The top 20% of scores (15) are all 28 or higher and have an average of 30.4.

ACT Composite Scores of 26 or Higher

The top 35% of scores (26) are all 26 or higher and have an average of 28.8.

ACT Composite Scores of 24 or Higher

The top 51% of scores (38) are all 24 or higher and have an average of 27.4.

Illinois State Scholars The average of the scores for the twenty Illinois State Scholars is 28.3.

Valedictorians The average of the scores for the fourteen valedictorians is 28.4.

Scholars The Class of 2022 included twenty Illinois State Scholars (22% of eligible members of the class).

National Honor Society (NHS)

Fifty-nine members (58%) of the Class of 2022 were members of NHS, having earned a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Scholarships Seventy-six members (75%) of the Class of 2022 received offers, which totaled \$11.3 million.

National Merit Commended Student

In the National Merit Scholarship Program, Caleigh Arentsen earned recognition as a commended student.

(Approximately 50,000 total students in the nation earn recognition as a commended student, a semifinalist, or a finalist.)

KNIGHTS SERVE

LEARNING OUR FAITH

Students enroll in a theology course each semester and participate in a day of retreat, with their class, each year.

We welcome students of other faith traditions, who currently represent 13% of our student body.

LOVING OUR FAITH

For our Masses, students serve as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, candle and cross bearers, greeters, lectors, and musicians.

Seniors have the opportunity to serve as catechists for PSR and YFF programs at local parishes.

LIVING OUR FAITH

Missions and Special Collections

During the 2021-2022 school year, our Mater Dei family raised a total of \$14,294 in support of class missions and special causes.

Service

Students provide service both as a school community and as individuals. Underclass students complete acts of service each semester, and seniors complete a three-week service project.

Liturgical Opportunities

Students participate in Mass and prayer both as a school community (seven Masses, optional daily prayer) and in their theology classes.

During Lent, we offer daily Eucharist services and a reconciliation service.
