KEY STEPS FOR APPLYING TO COLLEGES

<u>Application Deadlines</u> Students must carefully review application deadlines, as meeting application deadlines may be a requirement for merit scholarships.

<u>Transcripts</u> Students must utilize Parchment (www.parchment.com) to order transcripts. Mrs. Goetz will then review the order prior to processing the request. NOTE: If counselor information is requested, students must list Donna Goetz (dgoetz@materdeiknights.org)

<u>Common App</u> In the "Recommenders and FERPA" section for the colleges to which a student is applying ("My Colleges" tab), students must add Mrs. Goetz as the counselor. (Recommenders are also added in this section.)

Mrs. Goetz will electronically submit transcripts and the "Counselor's Report." Students must verify that the colleges to which they applied successfully accessed their completed application and supporting materials.

NOTES

In order for Mater Dei to receive ACT scores, the registration must include our CEEB code (where a student attends school). **The Mater Dei CEEB code is 140-395.**

Test accommodations must be requested at the time of registration. International and ELL students are eligible for extended time.

To avoid extra fees in the future, at the time of registration, students should list potential college choices to which they would like their ACT scores to be sent.

ACT TEST ENCOURAGED FOR ALL JUNIORS

Mrs. Goetz encourages all juniors to complete the ACT test.

Although some schools do not require the ACT test for admission, such as technical or trade schools and community colleges, the ACT sub-scores are often utilized for placement in English and math courses. When ACT scores are unavailable, students must then complete a placement test.

In addition, juniors who plan to enroll in our dual credit English 101 and English 102 courses as seniors must first attain a minimum score of 18 on the English section of the ACT test (or complete a placement test at Kaskaskia College).

Finally, ACT scores are required to for Illinois State Scholar eligibility (by June of junior year) and numerous scholarships.

CLASS OF 2023 HIGHLIGHTS

We are pleased to share ACT composite score statistics, as well as additional accomplishments, for our Class of 2023, as they reflect our tradition of academic excellence in a faith-filled environment!

ACT PERFORMANCE

<u>Illinois State Scholars</u> The average of the ACT composite scores for the seventeen Illinois State Scholars is 27.5.

<u>Valedictorians</u> The average of the ACT composite scores for the eleven valedictorians is 26.5.

ACT Composite Scores

- **29 or higher** The top 12% of scores (8) are all 29 or higher and have an average of 30.3.
- **27 or higher** The top 23% of scores (15) are all 27 or higher and have an average of 28.7.
- **25 or higher** The top 37% of scores (24) are all 25 or higher and have an average of 27.4.
- **23** or higher The top 60% of scores (39) are all 23 or higher and have an average of 25.9.

NOTE: Statistics do not include ACT scores of our "single-year" international students.

ADDITIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

<u>Scholars</u> The Class of 2023 included seventeen Illinois State Scholars (20% of eligible class members) <u>and</u> one National Merit Scholarship Program Commended Student. (Approximately 50,000 students in the nation earn NMSP recognition.)

<u>Scholarships</u> Sixty-four members (75%) of the Class of 2023 received scholarship offers, which totaled over \$7 million.

National Honor Society (NHS) Fifty-three members (62%) of the Class of 2023 were members of NHS, having earned a GPA of 3.6 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

<u>College Credit Hours</u> Through enrollment in our dual credit courses, our Class of 2023 earned nearly 1,500 credit hours, which is an average of 17 credit hours per student.

<u>Faith</u> The Class of 2023 included six catechists for Youth Faith Formation (YFF) and Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs and fourteen extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

<u>Service</u> The Class of 2023 provided nearly 12,500 hours of Service, donated to orphanages in Haiti and Venezuela as their class mission, and contributed \$712 for a Pay It Forward Scholarship for the Class of 2027.

CALENDAR DRIVE INCENTIVES

- 1) A student who meets his/her quota of eight (8) or more calendar sales will receive a day off school April 12, 2024.
- 2) After a student sells eight (8) calendars (\$200), he/she may wear jeans or sweatpants and a Mater Dei spirit shirt or sweatshirt on all Fridays during the Calendar Drive (through and including January 26, 2024).
- 3) <u>Each</u> homeroom that meets its quota will receive a snack. When <u>all</u> students in a homeroom meet their quota, they will receive a free beverage coupon. At the conclusion of the drive, for each grade, the students in the homeroom with the highest percentage over their quota will receive a free beverage coupon.
