REQUEST FOR PARENTAL SUPPORT

attendance and dress code

Our administration and faculty take great pride in the high level of support our parents continually provide throughout the school year. Therefore, as we prepare for our final quarter together, we are requesting additional support with attendance and dress code for the remainder of the year.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u> Please remind your child that tardies are accumulated for <u>all</u> periods, including homeroom. In addition, after the first ten minutes of a period, a student is considered absent. (As a reminder, first period begins at 8:10 a.m.)

<u>DRESS CODE</u> Please remind your child that only <u>long-sleeve</u> sweatshirts that are Columbia blue, gray, navy, or white and have a Mater Dei logo are permitted. In addition, a dress code polo shirt must be worn under crewneck sweatshirts.

For parents of male students, please remind your son that he must be clean shaven with sideburns no longer than his ear lobes, his bangs may not cover his eyebrows, and his hair may not touch his collar.

KASKASKIA COLLEGE PLACEMENT TEST AT MATER DEI

Kaskaskia College will offer their placement tests at Mater Dei as follows:

Math: March 15, pd. 1 study hall for seniors planning to attend Kaskaskia College

English & Writing: April 5, pd. 6 study hall for juniors planning to enroll in our English 101 or CNA courses who have not earned an ACT English score of 18 and for seniors planning to attend Kaskaskia College

NOTE: Students must register with Mrs. Goetz <u>and</u> complete Kaskaskia College's free admission application (<u>www.kaskaskia.edu/admissions</u>) prior to completing the placement test(s).

ACT TEST AT MATER DEI: APRIL 13

For the ACT test at Mater Dei on April 13, the registration deadline is March 8. (The late registration deadline, which includes a late fee, is March 24.) Registration information is available in the College Placement Office and on the ACT website (www.act.org). See Mrs. Goetz for a \$5-off coupon.

NOTE: If the registration page shows no seats available, please immediately inform Mrs. Goetz via email or Teams chat, as she can add additional seats.

ACT MATH "BOOT CAMP" APRIL 6

Miss Sackett will offer an ACT math "boot camp" prep session on Saturday, April 6, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The fee is only \$10. Mrs. Goetz will accept registrations and payments (cash).

NOTE: A minimum of eight students is required.

NOTES

In order for Mater Dei to receive ACT scores, the registration must include our CEEB code (where a student attends school). **The Mater Dei CEEB code is 140-395.**

Test accommodations must be requested at the time of registration. International and ELL students are eligible for extended time.

To avoid extra fees in the future, at the time of registration, students should list potential college choices to which they would like their ACT scores to be sent.

ACT TEST ANSWERS

Students who complete the ACT test at a national test center on a national test date in December, April, or June may order the ACT Test Information Release (TIR) for \$32 per test (\$40 if ordered after the test).

The TIR may be ordered at the time of registration or during the six-month period after the student's test date.

The TIR provides a digital copy of the test questions, a student's answers, and the answer key. For the writing test, a student will receive a copy of the writing prompt, the scoring rubric, and the scores assigned to his/her essay.
