ACT MATH TEST PREP AT MATER DEI: DECEMBER 6

Miss Sackett will offer an ACT math test prep session on Saturday, December 6, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The fee is only \$10. Mrs. Goetz will accept registrations and payments (cash) through Thursday, December 4.

NOTE: A minimum number of eight students is required.

KEY STEPS FOR APPLYING TO COLLEGES

Application Deadlines Students must carefully review application deadlines, as meeting application deadlines may be a requirement for merit scholarships.

Transcripts Students must order transcripts via Parchment (www.parchment.com). Mrs. Goetz will then review the order prior to processing the request.

NOTE: If counselor information is requested, students must list Donna Goetz (dgoetz@materdeiknights.org)

Common App In the “Recommenders and FERPA” section for the colleges to which a student is applying (“My Colleges” tab), students must add Mrs. Goetz as the counselor. (Teacher recommenders are also added in this section.)

Students must order transcripts via Parchment (www.parchment.com) by selecting “The Common Application (First Year Applicants)” as the delivery destination.

Students must verify that the colleges to which they applied successfully accessed their completed application and supporting materials.

NOTES

In order for Mater Dei to receive ACT scores, the registration must include our CEEB code (where a student attends school). **The Mater Dei CEEB code is 140-395.**

Test accommodations must be requested at the time of registration. International and ELL students are eligible for extended time.

To avoid extra fees in the future, at the time of registration, students should list potential college choices to which they would like their ACT scores to be sent.

ACT TEST ENCOURAGED FOR ALL JUNIORS

Mrs. Goetz encourages all juniors to complete the ACT test.

Although some schools do not require the ACT test for admission, such as technical or trade schools and community colleges, the ACT sub-scores are often utilized for placement in English and math courses. When ACT scores are unavailable, students must then complete a placement test.

In addition, juniors who plan to enroll in our dual credit English 101 and English 102 courses as seniors must first attain a minimum score of 18 on the English section of the ACT test (or complete a placement test at Kaskaskia College).

Finally, ACT scores are required for Illinois State Scholar eligibility (by June of junior year) and numerous scholarships.

CLASS OF 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

ACT PERFORMANCE

Illinois State Scholars The average of the ACT composite scores for the eighteen Illinois State Scholars is 26.4.

Valedictorians The average of the ACT composite scores for the seventeen valedictorians is 26.3.

ACT Composite Scores

- 30 or higher:** The top 6% of scores (5) are all 30 or higher and have an average of 30.8.
- 27 or higher:** The top 12% of scores (10) are all 27 or higher and have an average of 29.6.
- 25 or higher:** The top 18% of scores (15) are all 25 or higher and have an average of 28.3.
- 23 or higher:** The top 30% of scores (25) are all 23 or higher and have an average of 26.4.

NOTE: Statistics include scores for the 83 of 92 Class of 2025 members who reported ACT composite scores. Scores for our "single-year" international students are not included in the statistics.

We are pleased to share ACT statistics and additional accomplishments for our Class of 2025, as they reflect our tradition of academic excellence in a faith-filled environment!

ADDITIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Scholars The Class of 2025 included eighteen Illinois State Scholars (20% of eligible class members).

Academic Honors Forty-eight members (52%) of the Class of 2025 earned academic honors: twenty-seven summa cum laude (3.9 to 4.0 GPA), eleven magna cum laude (3.8 to 3.89 GPA), ten cum laude (3.7 to 3.79 GPA).

Scholarships Sixty-seven members (71%) of the Class of 2025 received scholarship offers, which totaled over \$8 million.

National Honor Society (NHS) Fifty-four members (59%) of the Class of 2025 were members of NHS, having earned a GPA of 3.6 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

College Credit Hours Through enrollment in our dual credit courses, our Class of 2025 earned nearly 1,859 college credit hours, which is an average of 20 college credit hours per student.

Faith The Class of 2025 included seven catechists who served local Youth Faith Formation (YFF) and Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs **and** fourteen extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

Service For four years, the Class of 2025 provided service related to the Works of Mercy **and** donated to St. Anne Mission Hospital in Kenya, Africa, as their class mission. They also funded a \$1,000 Pay It Forward Scholarship for the Class of 2029.

Now in its 41st year, the Calendar Drive, which is the only fundraiser for which we request participation from all students, serves as the cornerstone of our fundraising. **Therefore, the participation of all families in the 2026 Calendar Drive is essential!**

The "sales pitch" is simple: for only \$25, a buyer will have 391 chances to win cash (\$30 daily, \$100 and \$500 monthly, and \$1,000 and \$2,000 on December 31). CALENDAR DRIVE INCENTIVES

- 1) A student who meets his/her quota of eight (8) or more calendar sales will receive a day off school March 20, 2026.
- 2) After a student sells eight (8) calendars (\$200), he/she may wear jeans or sweatpants and a Mater Dei spirit shirt or sweatshirt on all Fridays during the Calendar Drive (through and including January 30, 2026).
- 3) Each homeroom that meets its quota will receive a snack. When all students in a homeroom meet their quota, they will receive a free beverage coupon. At the conclusion of the drive, the students in the homeroom with the highest percentage over their quota will receive a free beverage coupon.
- 4) When a student sells ten (10) or more calendars, he/she will earn special dress days and receive prize money as follows: \$5 for the first ten (10) calendars sold and \$10 for every additional five (5) calendars sold.
- 5) For the freshman, sophomore, and junior classes, the top salesperson in each class will receive a \$500 tuition credit, and the second place salesperson in each class will receive a \$200 tuition credit. (Credit surpassing a tuition balance will be applied to next year's tuition.)
- 6) For the senior class, the top salesperson will receive a \$500 tuition credit, the second place salesperson will receive a \$250 tuition credit, and the third place salesperson will receive a \$150 tuition credit. (Credit surpassing a tuition balance will be awarded in cash.)
- 7) The last day to earn prizes is January 30, 2026. Prize money will be available February 4, 2026, through February 27, 2026.
